Our UOCC Has Its New Metropolitan

During the assembly of the Holy and Sacred Synod July 21 and 22, 2022, His Grace Bishop Ilarion was elevated be to His Eminence Archbishop Ilarion of Winnipeg, Metropolitan of the Ukrainian Orthodox Church in Canada under the Ecumenical Patriarchate.

SOBOR XXIV – Brief Summary

SOBOR XXIV took place on June 13-19, 2022 as a hybrid in-person and virtual meeting. Delegates gathered in each of 6 cathedrals across Canada (Vancouver, Edmonton, Saskatoon, Winnipeg, Toronto, and Montreal) and each of the cathedral gatherings were connected virtually to each other – a rather impressive technological undertaking in my opinion. So, all Alberta based delegates gathered in St. John's Cathedral in Edmonton, including the delegates from our Parish - Lesia Perrit, Vivian and Ernest Skakun, and Michael Zukiwsky. The reason for the hybrid nature was to minimize travel of delegates from across Canada to a common location, because at the time of planning, COVID-19 pandemic was much less settled than it is now. Minimizing travel minimized risk to the delegates considering people gathering and the potential difficulties of travel during the COVID-19 pandemic.

At this SOBOR XXIV we elected a new Metropolitan, a new Chancellor, and a new Consistory Board.

The new Metropolitan of the UOCC is as written in the previous section of this letter. However, the delegates of the SOBOR elected a different candidate. This difference between who was elected and who was elevated is seen in some circles as concerning. This concern will likely be addressed by the Consistory Board.

The new Chancellor for the UOCC is Father Charles Baxter.

Members of the new Consistory Board are not listed herein as my notes of those elected are not complete. However, I do comment that the 9 Board members from the laity representatives were acclaimed without election because the number wishing to run and the number of positions to fill were equal. A first and a second ballot was required to fill the positions from the clergy representatives.

As well as elections as identified above, the delegates reviewed, debated, and voted on 4 previously presented resolutions, 12 "from the floor" resolutions, and 8 previously presented changes to bylaws. Reports prepared and circulated ahead of time to delegates were heard from the Chancellor (outgoing), the Consistory Treasurer, Auditors, and St. Andrew's College. As usual, the UOCC Foundation AGM was held, occurring as part of the SOBOR itinerary. Ratification of the actions of the following committees also occurred: SOBOR working groups: SOBOR Planning Committee, SOBOR Program Committee, Credentials Committee, Rozmet Committee, Nominating Committee, Media and PR Committee, Resolutions Committee, and Rules and Procedures Committee.

Was this hybrid nature perfect and without issues and technical glitches? Of course not, but we succeeded in holding SOBOR XXIV. In my opinion, the technicians who brought this hybrid meeting together were top notch and deserve credit for a job well done. At the end of SOBOR XXIV there was a questionnaire in which the delegates were asked participate, where a number of questions were in regard to SOBOR's hybrid nature. Of all the people attending at the Edmonton Cathedral that I talked to, I did not find a single person who liked the hybrid nature SOBOR.

More information will be presented to the membership after the official minutes of the SOBOR XXIV are issued. I also notice that at the time of writing, the UOCC website has not been updated to show the result of the SOBOR XXIV elections.

Ukraine continues to suffer from the inhumane assault and war from The Russian Federation, displacing millions of residents to other parts of Ukraine and to international destinations including Canada and Alberta. **Ukrainians continue to need our assistance whether financial, material, or through you being a volunteer.**

To make a monetary donation for specific or general need to Ukrainians near or far, a donation to the Canada-Ukraine Foundation can be made.

To make a monetary donation for humanitarian aid for those in Ukraine, a donation to the Western Eparchy of the UOCC can be made, specifying that it be transferred the *Orthodox Church in Ukraine* for Humanitarian Aid.

PLEASE SPECIFY THE <u>ORTHODOX CHURCH IN UKRAINE</u> (WHICH IS UNDER THE PATRIARCH IN CONSTANTINOPLE AND IN COMMUNION WITH OUR UOCC) versus the Ukrainian Orthodox Church (which is under the patriarch in Moscow no longer in communion with our UOCC). PLEASE SPECIFY THE FORMER!

St. Andrew's Sobor Parish continues to collect cheques and cash to either of these organizations, and we will pass on these collected monies to the appropriate organizations. Ensure to include your name and address on the cheque or with your cash donation if you wish a receipt suitable for income tax purposes.

More Ukrainian Nationals are attending our Parish

Over the past little while, more Ukrainian Nationals are starting to attend our Parish. Please introduce yourselves to them. They may not speak English, but try to communicate nonetheless even if you cannot speak Ukrainian. The Board is gathering information for distribution about where the newcomers can reach out for assistance.

Unfortunately, COVID-19 is still here

Unfortunately, COVID-19 and its variants remain in our community and can still make us sick, especially those who are immunocompromised. Therefore, precautions continue to be necessary for all of us at St. Andrew's Sobor Parish.

We ask and strongly urge you – if you are feeling sick, have any of the symptoms of COVID-19, or have come in contact with a COVID-19 or a variant case (regardless of vaccination status), that you do not attend worship services or come to any other function at the parish.

We ask that you follow the AB Government's isolation and quarantining recommendations.

Furthermore, regardless if you have symptoms and have taken a rapid test at home and it shows you to not have COVID-19, we ask you to remain away from the parish. It is reported that the results of those tests can be wrong because of the nature of the test and that the procedures to implement a rapid test are specific – any individual who incorrectly performs those procedures can easily and inadvertently affect the test result.

<u>Updated COVID-19 protocol and a new COVID-19 vaccination protocol for St. Andrew's</u>

To ensure that we continue to be as safe as we can to each other, we continue to monitor how we celebrate worship services in our Parish. Dear Parish Members, Associate Members, and Friends of the Parish;

As we cautiously approach the beginning of a New Church Year in September, we are requesting your participation in serving as greeters and hosting Sunday Fellowships. This request is being made on behalf of the Ladies Auxiliary and the Parish Board of Management.

Very briefly, greeters are like host and hostess in a home. They meet and greet church attendees when they come into the church. If they are first-time attendees, have them sign the guest book, help them to a pew, introduce them to other Parish members, and invite them to join the Sunday Fellowship following the service.

Hosting a Sunday Fellowship requires a team of 2-4 people (men can be hosts) who prepare a light snack (not a full course meal) with coffee following the Sunday Divine Liturgy Service. The team is responsible for buying/ making and preparing the items for the light snack. The team is also responsible for cleaning up. If you are willing to help host a Sunday Fellowship, please let us know.

Many of you have served as team captains for Sunday Fellowships in the past. If you are willing to serve as team captain again, we suggest that you contact your team members and see whether they can serve again. Please let us know who are your team members.

If you can serve as a greeter and/or help host a Sunday Fellowship, we prefer to hear from you by Wednesday August 17 so that we can plan a roster of greeters and teams for Sunday Fellowship.

The Board of Management and the whole parish needs your help

This section of the letter is a repeat from the previous letter to the membership due to its extreme importance. Please consider volunteering!

At the Annual General Meeting, all positions on the Board of Management were not filled. And, most of this year's Board members have been on the Board for two terms. Consequently, the following issues exist:

- Some activities within the parish are not being completed as thoroughly as they should, as some Board members are pulling "double duty" and completing their usual and additional duties. This is not healthy for the organization as perhaps some activities are not being completed and volunteer burnout can occur.
- 2. Decisions requiring broad debate by the Board may only see limited debate because the number of "opinions" is reduced with reduced Board size. And, perhaps some differing points of view are not brought forward and discussed. This is indirectly not healthy for the parish members as appropriate stewardship of the parish's assets could be eroded.
- New Board members are not learning from experience. The existing procedures and items necessary to manage the parish are not being shown to less experienced Board members and new members are not learning from the mistakes that undoubtedly occur regardless of Board experience.

Without a full complement of Board members, the whole health of the Parish is not only directly and immediately affected, but the longevity of OUR parish is reduced.

Please talk to any of the existing Board members about volunteering to serve on the Board of Management. The parish will benefit directly and you will benefit indirectly!
